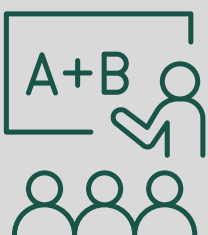

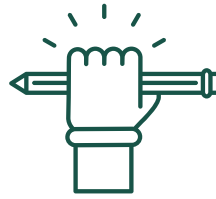

Stories from Lebanon

meet Joe

Joe and his family live in a remote Lebanese village. Prior to the crisis Joe ran a productive welding trade which allowed him to provide for his family quite comfortably.

In the last 2 years, Joe lost access to his savings, stuck in Lebanon's banks, in the criminal heist that hit the nation.

As currency lost 90% of its value, he lost the ability to repair his machines or even buy fuel for the generator which powers his small business. Electric power in Lebanon is a luxury.

For context, parts and fuel are in Dollars; income is in Liras.

We came across Joe by referral. He was too proud to approach us, and he was at the verge of breakdown. (Joe is not his name, obviously).

You see, Joe has 3 children, one of whom with severe chronic medical needs. A failing business may sustain food for a while, but not these costs as well. And he has to drive his kid to the city every week for the very costly therapy (now partly subsidized by a humanitarian agency).



meet Joe (cont'd)

We could see the conundrum.

If Joe leaves the country for higher income, and if it were at all possible to find work elsewhere, who would care for his family?

We made a deal with Joe.

A living stipend of \$100 a month to cover part of the food and medical bills.

And another \$100 a month as a business grant, to fix his machines and to buy fuel supply for electricity.

For 6 months, so he has a chance to get back on his feet.

There are hundreds just like Joe. Parents who are committed to their families and to their country, hardworking, and willing to fight.

We are here for those parents that won't give up.
